HIGHLIGHTS OF THE MONTH...

### Exclusion periods

As there are currently quite a few children off nursery poorly, Little Learners thought you might like some information along with the opportunity to refresh your memories on the exclusion periods we have at nursery.

**Sickness and diarrhea** - your child should not attend nursery until 48 hours after the last episode of sickness or diarrhea.

**Chickenpox**- your child should not attend nursery until all blisters have scabbed.

**Head lice**- you child is allowed back to nursery once they have been treated.

**Scarlett fever**- you child can come back to nursery after 24 hours after having the first dose of anti-biotics.

**Hand, foot and mouth**- your child should not attend nursery until all blisters have scabbed.

**Ring worm**- your child is allowed back to nursery after the first treatment.

**Scabies**- your child is allowed back to nursery once treated.

**Mumps**- your child can not attend nursery until 5 days after swollen glands.

**Measles**- your child is not allowed to attend nursery until 4 days after rash has appeared.

**German measles (Rubella)**- your child can not attend nursery until 6 days after the rash has appeared.

**Conjunctivitis**- there is no exclusion period for conjunctivitis, your child will be sent home but once first dose of eye drops is given they can return.

## Parents please...

If your child is prescribed medicine please ensure that when bringing it into nursery that it is in the bottle and box in which you was given it as if not we will not be able to give it to your child.

We have a 48 hour exclusion period for prescribed medicine that your child has not had before this is to ensure that the child does not have an allergic reaction.

No calpol can be given unless your child has a high temperature in which we will ring a parent/guardian to get consent to give calpol. If the temperature does not go down within 30mins of giving calpol you will be rung to pick up your child.

**Please remember to always fill out a medicine form when bringing in prescribed medicine.**
